

Pasangan kekasih menyamar polis

Menyamar sebagai polis bertujuan memeras ugut warga asing. Itu tindakan pasangan kekasih yang ditahan polis selepas menyamun pekerja kilang warga asing di Taman Desa Cemerlang di sini, malam Jumaat lalu.

Ketua Polis Daerah Seri Alam, Superintendant Ismail Dollah berkata, kedua-dua suspek berusia awal 30-an itu ditahan jam 3.30 petang kelmarin selepas polis menerima laporan dibuat mangsa warga Bangladesh.

Menurutnya, mangsa berusia 24 tahun mendakwa didatangi dua suspek ketika berada di tepi jalan di Taman Desa Cemerlang, di sini.


"Suspek menaiki motosikal memperkenalkan diri sebagai anggota polis dan memberitahu mahu

mengarahkan mangsa menunjukkan pasport.

"Gagal menunjukkan pasport menyebabkan mangsa dibawa ke sebuah taman permainan di kawasan berhampiran sebelum dipukul dan telefon pintarnya dirampas.

"Minyak motosikal suspek bagaimanapun habis sebelum suspek mengarahkan mangsa menolak kenderaan itu. Mangsa yang mengesyaki suspek bukan anggota polis meminta pertolongan orang awam," katanya pada sidang media di Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Seri Alam di sini, semalam.

Menurutnya, hasil maklumat dan risikan, pihaknya menahan suspek lelaki di bilik sewanya di Taman Puteri Wangsa di sini, petang kelmarin.

Jika sebelum ini bungkus-an atau peket jis buah menjadi pilihan sindiket dadah namun terbaharu sampul ber tulis boarding pass syarikat penerbangan lengkap butiran penerbangan jadi pilihan pengedar.

Sampul itu dikesan disumbat dengan serbuk ekstasi untuk mengabur pihak berkusa sebelum diserahkan pada pelanggan.

Bagaimanapun, Polis Da-

rah Seri Alam menghidu taklit digunakan pengedar dadah itu selain merampas emam boarding pass.

Turut dirampas, 61 bungkus serbuk ekstasi yang dipekat ke dalam bungkus-an dewang.

Ketua Polis Daerah Seri Alam, Suptrenden Ismail Dollah berkata, rampasan dadah dengan bungkus-an baharu itu dibuat jam 8.00 malam, Rabu lalu, susulan penahanan suspek berusia 30 tahun di tepi Jalan Harmoni 3/9, Taman Desa Harmoni, di si-

ni. Menurutnya, pemeriksaan terhadap kereta suspek menyemai 67 paket serbuk ekstasi seberat 5.117 gram (5.1 kilogram) dianggarkan bernilai RM13,400.

"Hasil siasatan awal, kami dapati dadah ini turut dikesan positif metamphetamine merentasi ujian saringan awal air kencing, namun tidak mempunyai rekod menjah lampau."

"Sampel direman hingga Selasa ini bagi membantu siasatan mengikut Seksyen 39B Akta Dadah Berbahaya 1952 dan mengesahkan sekiranya ada individu lain terlibat dalam aktiviti ini," katanya.

Tak jejas industri pelancongan Johor

Johor Bahru: Pencemaran Sungai Kim Kim, Pasir Gudang di sini, yang menggemparkan negara bermula 7 Mac lalu, tidak menjekas-kan kemasukan pelancong domestik dan antarabangsa ke negeri ini.

Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Pembangunan Wanita dan Pelancongan Johor, Liow Cai Tung berkata, walaupun insiden itu berlurut selama kira-kira dua minggu, pihaknya tidak menerima sebarang aduan keengganan pelancong datang ke Johor.

"Johor masih selamat untuk dikunjungi. Kerajaan negeri tidak menerima sebarang laporan atau aduan yang berhubung kait dengan pelancong tidak mahu melancong ke negeri ini."

"Johor adalah sebuah ne-

geri yang mempunyai tempat menarik dan tentu saja kemasukan pelancong domestik dan antarabangsa akan meningkat setiap tahun.

"Dengan pembabitan pelbagai pemain industri pelancongan, perangkaan keemasukan pelancongan mencatatkan peningkatan iaitu sebanyak 15.84 juta orang pada hujung tahun lalu iaitu peningkatan 8.82 peratus atau 1.4 juta orang berbanding hanya 14.44 juta keemasukan pelancong pada 2017," katanya.

Cai Tung berkata, kerajaan negeri menyasarkan kemasukan pelancong sehingga 16.6 juta orang tahun ini, selain mengharapkan kira-kira lapan juta pelancong menetap di Johor untuk sekurang-kurangnya satu malam.

Dengan adanya Tahun Melawat Johor 2020 dan Sukan Malaysia (SUKMA) 2020, diharapkan jumlah

kemasukan mencecah sekurang-kurangnya seramai 17.4 juta orang dengan 8.4 juta pelancong menghabiskan sekurang-kurangnya satu malam di sini.

Menurutnya, berikutnya itu pihaknya menggalakkan pemain industri di setiap 10 daerah di Johor memainkan peranan lebih proaktif dalam menyumbang pembangunan pelancongan negeri selain mewujudkan peluang pekerjaan kepada komuniti setempat.

"Industri pelancongan Johor akan membangun dengan jayanya apabila ada kerjasama daripada semua pihak kerana ia bukan sahaja memberi gambaran positif kepada imej Johor, malah memberi manfaat kepada masyarakat," katanya.

Sungai Kim Kim pusat perniagaan atas air pertama

PASIR GUDANG 7 April - Sungai Kim Kim di sini yang tercemar sebelum ini akibat pembuangan toksik haram bakal menjadi pusat perniagaan atas air pertama di negara ini.

Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri (ADUN) Permas Jaya, Datuk Seri Che Zakaria Salleh berkata, sebelum pembangunan dilakukan, pihaknya akan membersihkan sungai sepanjang 1.5 kilometer itu selama tiga bulan.

"Kami sudah melantik kontraktor yang akan membersihkan Sungai Kim Kim selama tiga bulan, apabila bersih dan bebas pencemaran, kami akan bina gerai untuk orang ramai berniaga.

"Kami akan memberikan konsep baharu untuk merancak-

kan ekonomi dan pada masa sama, menjaga kebersihan sungai berkenaan supaya 'hidup' semula," katanya dalam sidang akhbar di Pusat Khidmat Masyarakat Dewan Undangan Negeri (DUN) Permas di sini kelmarin.

Pencemaran sisa toksik di sungai itu pada 7 Mac lalu menjaskan lebih 6,000 penduduk setempat termasuk pelajar sekolah hingga memaksa kerajaan menutup operasi 111 sekolah.

Mengulas lanjut, Che Zakaria berkata, cadangan yang dipersejui oleh Menteri Besar, Datuk Osman Sapian dan Majlis

Perbandaran Pasir Gudang itu akan berjalan dalam masa terdekat.


Menurut beliau lagi, perancangan tersebut bukan sahaja dapat membantu masyarakat setempat menjalankan perniagaan malah menjadikan Sungai Kim Kim sebagai tarikan pelancongan ke Johor.

Dalam masa sama katanya, aktiviti perniagaan yang dijalankan akan dapat menghalang sebarang aktiviti pembuangan sisa toksik di sungai berkenaan berikutnya dikunjungi ramai orang.

Rampas serbuk ekstasi bernilai RM13,400

PASIR GUDANG - Taktik licik sindiket dadah yang membungkus serbuk ekstasi dalam paket pewangi aromaterapi gagal mengejutkan pihak berkuasa apabila dirampas polis, Rabu lalu.

Selain itu, serbuk ekstasi yang dirampas turut dibungkus dalam paket menyerupai 'boarding pass' sebuah syarikat perniagaan.

Ketua Polis Daerah Seri Alam, Superintendant Ismail Dollah berkata, serbuk ekstasi seberat 5.1 kilogram bernilai RM13,400 yang dirampas itu ditemui dalam sebuah beg di bonet kereta dinaiki seorang lelaki.

"Sekitar jam 8.50 malam, sepasukan anggota dari Jabatan Siasatan Jenayah Narkotik, Ibu Pejabat Polis Kontinjen (IPK) Johor dan Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Seri Alam menahan seorang lelaki di tepi jalan di Taman Desa Harmoni.

"Semasa pemeriksaan


kenderaan dinaiki suspek, kita berjaya membuat ramasan sejumlah dadah disyaki serbuk ekstasi selain menangkap lelaki berusia 30 tahun terbabit," katanya pada sidang media di IPD Seri Alam di sini, semalam.

Ismail berkata, kebiasannya bungkus dadah seumpama itu digunakan dan dijual di pusat-pusat

hiburan.

Menurutnya, saringan air kencing ke atas suspek mendapati lelaki terbabit positif dadah, namun tiada sebarang rekod jenayah lampau.

"Polis turut merampas wang tunai berjumlah RM400 dan lelaki terbabit direman bermula Khamis lalu sehingga hari ini," katanya.

Menyamar polis samun warga asing

PASIR GUDANG - Dua individu ditanah selepas menyamun dengan menyamar sebagai anggota polis dalam kejadian di kawasan pentadbiran Ibu Pejabat Polis Daerah (IPD) Seri Alam, di sini, kelmarin.

Ketua Polis Daerah Seri Alam, Superintendant Ismail Dollah berkata, tangkapan ke atas dua suspek terdiri daripada lelaki dan wanita berusia lingkungan 30-an itu dibuat hasil maklumat dan risikan.

"Kita buat tangkapan ekoran daripada satu laporan polis dibuat seorang warga asing di kawasan Pasir Gudang di mana mangsa menyatakan seorang perempuan dan seorang lelaki mengaku sebagai polis dan meminta pasport daripada mangsa.

"Mangsa gagal menunjukkan dokumen tersebut dan suspek mengarahkan mangsa naik motosikal dan dibawa ke satu taman permainan berhampiran. Di taman tersebut, mangsa telah disamun, diambil telefon bimbit-


nya, dipukul kemudian ditinggalkan di situ," katanya pada sidang media di IPD Seri Alam di sini, semalam.

Ismail berkata, susulan laporan polis yang dibuat pada jam 12.09 pagi itu, pihaknya berjaya menahan dua suspek terbabit sekitar jam 3.30 petang di dua lokasi berasingan selain merampas telefon bimbit yang diambil daripada mangsa selain motosikal digunakan.

"Kes ini disiasat di bawah Seksyen 395 Kanun Keseksaan kerana samun dan Seksyen 170 Kanun Keseksaan kerana menyamar sebagai penjawat awam," katanya.

Johor MB still safe for now

Osman to meet PM today amid speculation that he will step down

JOHOR BARU: The position of Johor Menteri Besar Datuk Osman Sapian looks safe for now after speculation swirled that he may have to step down.

It is understood that the Johor palace was dissatisfied with the way Osman handled the Sungai Kim Kim toxic gas contamination, which saw the closure of 111 schools in Pasir Gudang.

Speculation mounted that his career was in jeopardy when word got out that Prime Minister Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad was set to meet Osman at his office in Putrajaya today.

A check with aides at the Prime Minister's Office confirmed that such a meeting was scheduled for the evening.

The meeting comes ahead of Dr Mahathir having to receive his Singaporean counterpart Lee Hsien Loong at the Ninth Singapore-Malaysia Leaders' Retreat.

"Meeting is on. Talks – no idea," said a source when asked about the speculation of a reshuffle of both the menteri besar as well as the state exco line-up.

The retreat is also being attended by Lee's deputy and at least five other Singaporean ministers – the first since Pakatan Harapan came to power last year.

When contacted, Osman's press secretary Abdul Hakim Ab Rahman downplayed the meeting, calling it a "scheduled meeting".

"The Menteri Besar wanted to meet the Prime Minister to discuss matters on preparations for the retreat.

"There will be a pre-council meeting for the delegation and a dinner in conjunction with the retreat," he said, adding that early preparations for such meetings were the norm.

"Don't believe the rumours," Abdul Hakim added.

Should Osman have to go, among the contenders for the post are Johor Health, Environment and Agriculture Committee chairman Dr Sahrul Jamal, who is from Bersatu, and State Youth, Sports and Culture Committee chairman Mohd Khuzuan Abu Bakar from PKR.

Osman, who is also state Parti Pribumi Bersatu Malaysia and Pakatan Harapan chairman, is under pressure following a series of missteps since assuming the Menteri Besar post, the latest of which was the federal government's proposed Ship-to-Ship transfer hub project in Johor Baru earlier this month.

Following criticism that Putrajaya had bulldozed the project, Dr Mahathir said Osman was well aware of the planned development.

The Kempas assemblyman was also heavily criticised when he went to Batam at the height of the Sungai Kim Kim toxic gas

contamination crisis.

There has also been talk of a recent housing scandal involving the purchase of a property with huge discounts.

The meeting between Dr Mahathir and Osman will also take place amid the backlash following the Prime Minister's announcement on Friday that the Malaysian government had been forced to retract according to the Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court.

During a press conference on Friday, a visibly upset Dr Mahathir said the government "was forced" to withdraw following confusion created by those with political interests, calling it an attempt to undermine both the government and him as the Prime Minister.

He also alluded several times to the involvement of royalty in protests against the ratification.

Meanwhile, Johor PKR chairman Hassan Abdul Karim expressed support for Osman to remain as Menteri Besar, saying that there was no need for a reshuffle of the state exco for the time being.

"As the Johor PKR chairman, trust Osman. I'm quite vocal in criticising him openly, but he listens and is sincere in developing Johor."

"He works together with other component parties," he said, adding that there were regular State Pakatan council meetings chaired by Osman.

"So, we meet him regularly and

we have a platform to offer suggestions and politely criticise him in the closed door meetings."

"He accepts the criticism positively," said Hassan.

While he acknowledged Osman's shortcomings, Hassan said it was necessary for leaders in the state to give him time and space.

"We must also be fair to the Menteri Besar. We don't know whether some of the allegations are true or fake, so we are giving space to him to answer."

"Unless he commits a very serious legal, moral or political blunder, then it might be time to reshuffle," he said.

Asked about PKR taking over the Menteri Besar seat from Bersatu, Hassan, who has known Osman since their schooling days in Pontian, said all that would be decided at the national leadership.



Asked about the possibility of the state assembly being dissolved to pave the way for a snap election, he said this was unlikely as Pakatan had more than two-thirds majority with 39 seats.

Johor has 56 state seats and 26 parliamentary seats.

No free pass for latest drug trafficking ruse

PASIR GUDANG: Hiding drugs in plastic "boarding pass packets" seems to be the latest tactic by traffickers to avoid detection.

A police team from the Seri Alam Narcotics Crime Investigation Department (NCID) discovered the new modus operandi after seizing 5.1kg of powdered substance – believed to be ecstasy – worth RM13,400, packed in 67 plastic packets.

The seizure was made in Jalan Harmoni 3/9, Taman Desa Harmoni, last Wednesday at about 8.50pm, after the team noticed a man behaving suspiciously while driving a Proton Waja.

Seri Alam OCPD Supt Ismail Dollah said the team found the plastic packets in the car's bonnet.

A boarding pass design along with the emblem of a budget airline was printed on six of the plastic packets, he said.

"At first glance, it looked like a real travelling ticket packet but we found out there was no such merchandise produced by the airline," he said at a press conference at the Seri Alam police district headquarters (IPD) here yesterday.

He added that the 30-year-old suspect tested for methamphetamine but had no criminal record.

"Investigations are still ongoing to find out if there are others involved in this case," he said.

He added that the suspect would be on remand until tomorrow.

He said the drugs seized were enough to supply to 400 addicts.

Police believe the drugs were to be sold at entertainment centres in Johor Baru and Seri Alam.

The case falls under the Dangerous Drugs Act 1952.


In a separate case, Supt Ismail

said a man and a woman in their 30s were arrested for allegedly beating a 24-year-old Bangladeshi man and stealing his phone while posing as police officers.

He said the suspects approached

the victim at about 8.30pm last Friday on the pretext of wanting to check his passport.

He added the duo were arrested in Taman Puteri Wangsa, Ulu Tiram, the next day.

Dr M and Hsien Loong to meet over bilateral issues

SINGAPORE: It is obvious that both Malaysia and Singapore are keeping their channels of communication open in their efforts to solve bilateral issues, although tensions escalated at times due to "exchange" of words.

Through numerous meetings, two bilateral issues were successfully resolved.

One is the postponement of the Kuala Lumpur-Singapore High-Speed Rail. The other is on the airspace over Pasir Gudang.

Malaysia and Singapore are currently intensively working on solving several other outstanding mat-

ters, such as the maritime border issue and the 1962 Water Agreement.

Singapore Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong is scheduled to be in Malaysia for two days from April 8 to meet his Malaysian counterpart Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad at the 9th Singapore-Malaysia Leaders' Retreat.

The latest edition of the Retreat, which was supposed to be held in November last year, was postponed.

Dr Mahathir had on Friday said Malaysia and Singapore would hold discussions in a "friendly manner" on all unresolved issues during the

Retreat.

He and Lee will meet for the first time over the Leaders' Retreat platform, a vital mechanism to strengthen relations and find solutions for bilateral issues.

"It is good to continue with this tradition. Our leaders must come together from time to time to have a good heart-to-heart talk," said Ong Keng Yong, executive deputy chairman of the S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies at Nanyang Technological University.

Ong, through his experience, said the leaders were always able to use the opportunity to talk "directly and

candidly over bilateral issues".

"This particular process has been adopted over the past several years. Both sides see value in this," said Ong, who was High Commissioner of Singapore to Malaysia from 2011 to 2014.

Ong also hoped that both countries could find solutions to manage the bilateral tiffs based on Asean's "camaraderie spirit" while minding the positive image of the 52-year-old regional pact.

"When we have bilateral issues, let us find a way to resolve them. If we cannot resolve them quickly, we find a way to manage them," he said.

Meanwhile, Singapore CIMB Private Bank economist Song Seng Wun said: "The fact that there is going to be a face-to-face meeting between both leaders is already an encouraging sign after the annual Leaders' Retreat was postponed last November."

On whether bilateral issues could be resolved as "exchange" of words had taken place, Song noted that at the end of the day, "the resolutions will depend on how the two sides interpret legal documents or take further steps on whether to seek third-party arbitration." — Bernama
