Pedih sampai dalam telinga

■ Budak hidap psoriasis kronik adu sakit setiap masa

“Hampir 99 peratus tubuh anak saya mengelupas termasuk di dalam telinga hingga menyebabkan dia mengadu sakit setiap masa,” kata Fazlida Yazid, 28, di Taman Mawar, di sini, semalam.

Fazlida berkata, anak sulung daripada tiga beradik, Muhammad Aiman Farish Mohd Anuar, 7, menghidap penyakit psoriasis sejak berusia setahun mengakibatkan tubuhnya mengelupas, gatal dan alah cuaca panas.

Katanya, Muhammad Aiman terpaksa menyapukan minyak gamat dan ubat tahan gatal di seluruh badan setiap hari bagi mengelakkan keadaan bertambah buruk serta tidak selesa.

“Akibat penyakit dialami, anak saya tidak dapat bersukan dan perlu mengelakkan aktiviti yang mengakibatkan tubuhnya berpeluh kerana ia membuatkan dia pedih disebabkan kesan luka akibat psoriasis.

“Saya bersyukur guru dan rakan memahami keadaan Muhammad Aiman di sekolahnya di Sekolah Kebangsaan Pasir Gudang 4.

KEADAAN tubuh Muhammad Aiman yang mengelupas teruk.

menyebabkan dia bersempang ke sekolah,” katanya.

Fazlida berkata, dia difahamkan anaknya tiada peluang pulih sepenuhnya, sebaliknya rawatan diterima sekadar mengurangkan kesakitan dan kesan kulit mengelupas.

Menurutnya, setiap bulan keluarganya membelanjakan RM300 untuk membeli ubat bagi kegunaan Muhammad Aiman yang diperoleh di hospital awam.

“Buat masa ini, keluarga tinggal di bilik sewa dan kami membayar sewa RM250 sebulan.

“Kami berpindah dari Tanah Merah, Kelantan pada Jun lalu dan kini suami masih mencari pekerjaan tetap. Buat sementara waktu, dia bekerja sambil membuat pendawaian dan pendapatan keluarga kami hanya RM500 sebulan.

“Ia menimbulkan kesulitan bagi kami membeli ubat Muhammad Aiman kerana perlu mengurus perbelanjaan dapur serta menyara dua lagi anak berusia lapan bulan dan empat tahun,” katanya.

Sementara itu, Muhammad Aiman menerima kunjungan Ahli Parlimen Pasir Gudang Normala Abd Samad yang menghulurkan sumbangan kepada keluarga berkenaan.

Youngsters doing their part for road safety

Johor Road Transport Department Cadet's pioneer members learn to be disciplined and obey rules

JOHOR BARU: Muhammad Aiman Syafiq Samsol wants to reach out to his schoolmates to help spread better awareness and understanding of road safety.

The Fern Five student from SMK Pasir Gudang said as a member of the Road Transport Department Cadet (RTDC), it was his duty to educate them.

Mohamad Aiman said as members of the RTDC, he and his fellow squad members have been involved in road-related programmes which included road safety education.

"The programmes were very insightful as they taught us how to observe traffic rules while on the road," he told StarMetro after the launch of the RTDC by Johor RTD director Mohd Rusdi Mohd Darus recently.

SMK Pasir Gudang was chosen in 2015 to pioneer the RTDC programme in Johor and since then the state RTD has set up 22 RTDC in 22 schools statewide.

Mohamad Aiman said joining a uniformed body was a good decision for students as it helps them to learn to be disciplined.

Fellow RTDC member S. Miza Kamar, 17, agreed with Aiman as apart from helping students be disciplined, it also gave them good exposure on the role of the RTD.

"Road users have to follow the rules such as having a valid licence when riding motorcycles, which according to the RTD, most teenagers do not," he said.

Miza hoped that all students who rode motorcycles would apply for a licence.

He said those without one should avoid riding their motorcycles to school or even within their housing estates.

Muhammad Rahmad Ahmad, 17, said apart from students, parents who sent their children to school must follow the rules as accidents could happen at any time.

"The route between their houses and the school might be short but accidents can happen regardless of the distance," he said.

Meanwhile, Mohd Rusdi said parents and students in rural and remote areas in the country were exposing themselves to danger when riding motorcycles without a valid licence.

He said statistics showed that 90% of the road accidents in Malaysia yearly involved motorists and pillion riders aged between 16 and 25 years old.
