

School Parent-Teacher Association president Abdul Nasir Sabran said the orientation programme had been held since 2015. "Out of 2,400 pupils, 490 of


"Out of 2,400 pupils, 490 of them started their first day of school in Year One here.

# Dua anak derita sakit kronik

Ibu tunggal perlu bantuan anak hidap penyakit saraf, hypotonia

Bagaikan jatuh ditimpa tangga, itulah nasib se-orang ibu tunggal kepada tiga anak yang memerlukan sumbangan daripada orang ramai berikutan anak sulungnya disyaki menderita penyakit saraf manakala ba-

yinya mengalami 'hypotonia'. Empat bulan lepas, Nurul Ain Zakaria, 33, perlu menerima hakikat anak ketiganya, Nur Aurora Darmaya Amirul Amri, 5 bulan, mengalami hypotonia ataupun masalah otot lemah selain pelbagai komplikasi sejak dilahirkan termasuk kegagalan pernafasan dan kekejangan otot.

Terbaharu, awal bulan ini

pula, anak sulungnya, Nur Adriana Aqilah Muhammad Fairus, 10, pula mengalami masalah saraf, kadang kala hilang ingatan dan sawan ketika tidur.

"Apabila ramai orang, Nur Adriana Agilah macam tak selesa dan emosinya tak boleh dikawal. Memandangkan dia sudah besar dan dia tahu dia sakit, mungkin dia tidak boleh terima keadaan ini.

"Saya bimbang kadang kala dia (Nur Adriana Aqilah) terlupa dia berada di mana, ingatan dia lemah dan pernah keluar rumah seorang diri," katanya kepada pemberita selepas menerima sumbangan daripada Yayasan Pasir Gudang, di rumahnya di Taman Air Biru, dekat Pasir Gudang, yang disampaikan Adun Permas, Datuk Che' Zakaria Mohd Salleh.

Nurul Ain berkata, Nur Aurora Darmaya hanya bergantung kepada ubat dan sering mendapat rawatan di

Hospital Sultan Ismail, di sini, manakala Nur Adriana Agilah di Hospital Pakar Puteri, di sini, dengan kedua-dua anaknya itu perlu dibawa ke hospital dengan menggunakan dia tidak memiliki kenderaan.

Katanya, dia terpaksa berhenti kerja di sebuah kilang sejak Februari lepas akibat masalah kesihatan anak-

perkhidmatan Grab kerana anaknya itu dan hanya bergantung kepada bantuan daripada Jabatan Kebajikan Masyarakat sebanyak RM1,000 sebulan.
